Introduction

"When I'm asked the question, where are you from?, that's when I feel Armenian the most."

Hratch Tchilingirian

The Armenian diaspora is multifaceted, complex and geographically spread around the world. Yet, the main subject around which virtually all themes in diasporic life orbit is "Armenian identity." Unlike few decades ago, in contemporary times Armenian identity is largely self-defined, fluid and personalized. Armenians living in the same country or in the same state or city could have different perceptions and understanding of "Armenianness", depending on multiple variables, such as family upbringing, community, personal preferences, so on.

"I feel Armenian the most," said a male 18-30 years old professional in Michigan, "when I'm asked the question, where are you from?" He explained during an in-depth interview: "As an American, I've been raised in the American culture—so that's always been more at the forefront—but when I hear about Armenia, obviously I think about it more." But, a young woman in the same age group and living in the same state had a very different experience: "Even though I grew up in the United States, I grew up in this little post-Soviet Union Armenian community [in Lansing, Michigan], pretty much everyone in the community is Armenian, but most people came from Baku... [This] pretty much defined how I do anything." Another young woman in the same age group—with Irish and Jewish family heritage—said: "I identify mostly as Armenian even though I'm half [Armenian]. That's the side of the family that I've always really had the more cultural connection with." In Ontario, Canada, perceptions of "Armenianness" are as varied. A 18-30 years old, Lebanon-born young man living in Toronto, explained his thoughts, in mixed Armenian and English: "At this point, I consider myself more of an Armenian-Canadian than an Armenian-Lebanese," he said in an ADS interview. "Տունես դուրս, իմ գանատական մշակոյթը practice կընէի ամբողջութեամբ, իսկ իմ հայ ընկերներուս հետ իմ գանատահայ մշակոյթս practice կընէի, իսկ ընտանիքիս հետ իմ լիբանանահայ ենթամշակոյթս practice կընէի։ ...You have to manage every situation according to your audience, կրնայ բիչ մր անձին շուարեցնել... Then you run the risk of abandoning one." Another 31-50 years old woman in Ontario was emphatic: "I cannot imagine myself other than being Armenian. Only when I travel abroad, if someone asks me, I might say 'I am Canadian'. Only then, but I always feel Armenian."

Views and opinions on identity and related major themes, such as language, culture, community, and homeland, were studied as part of the Armenian Diaspora Survey (ADS) in 2022, which was held in the United States and Ontario, the second largest

province in Canada. The fieldwork took place between May - July in both countries. This is the third in the three-rounds research project, funded by the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation. The previous rounds were successfully completed in 2019 (Argentina, Lebanon, Montreal, Romania) and in 2021 (Belgium, Paris, United Kingdom and Rostov on Don).

The organization of the fieldwork in the US and Ontario was the most challenging among the three rounds of the survey, as we had to deal with a vast geography and large, spread out communities in both countries. We set up research teams and advisory committees in major metropolitan communities—Los Angeles, Michigan, New York/New Jersey and Toronto—but the online questionnaire was available for participants in all 50 US states and the entire Province of Ontario. We had respondents from 46 states in the US and from major cities in Ontario.

The communities in the US and Ontario

Although Armenians had settled in the United States and Canada in the 19th century, the large majority of the communities in both countries are formed starting in the early 20th century by the surviving generations of the Armenian Genocide in the Ottoman Empire. While both communities share certain characteristics and have similarities, there are also differences in how Armenian language and culture, for instance, are intertwined in community life. In some important respects, the policy of multiculturalism in Canada—the management of cultural diversity through formal initiatives on the federal, provincial and municipal levels—reinforces appreciation and actualization of ones heritage identity.

There are over 30,000 Armenians living in the Province of Ontario today, making it one of the largest Armenian communities in Canada, besides Montreal. The majority of Armenians in Ontario live in the Greater Toronto area, which has a vibrant and active Armenian community, thanks to well-established community organizations, churches, schools and cultural centers and media outlets. In recent years, a new wave of immigrants, escaping wars and conflicts especially in Syria, Lebanon, and Iraq has enriched the social and cultural life of Armenians in Ontario.

The Armenian American community is estimated at over one million today, mostly concentrated in the West Coast, Midwest and Northeast of the country. In terms of numbers, Los Angeles has the largest concentration of Armenians in the Diaspora. The community in the US has seen waves of new immigrants, especially after WWII, from the Soviet Union, Communist countries in Eastern Europe, the Middle East and Armenia since 1991. There are hundreds of Armenian Apostolic, Catholic and Evangelical churches, cultural and educational organizations, community centers and institutions, newspapers, scores of television channels and media outlets, which keep the Armenian American community vibrant and active in all walks of life. Armenians are well integrated in the United States and are active contributors to all aspects of American life.

Highlights of the opinions in the 2022 study

Armenian identity

Nearly **six in ten** (58%) in the **US** and **nearly half** (49%) in **Ontario** think of themselves as *hyphenated* Armenians—for example, Armenian-American, Canadian-Armenian, American of Armenian origin, half or partly Armenian (Q1). Fewer respondents in the US (40%), but nearly as many in Canada (48%) think of themselves simply as "Armenian." When asked in what ways do they define their Armenian identity (Q2), the three top responses are **Family** (US 84%, Ontario 81%), **Armenian language** (US 65%, Ontario 80%) and **Armenian culture** (dance, music, literature, etc.) (US 66%, Ontario 63%). These three were also the top responses in the communities surveyed in 2019 and 2021. Another defining element is "**Pride in Armenian History**" (US 57%, Ontario 52%). Interestingly, the younger generation is more proud of Armenian history, nearly seven in ten of the 18-24 years old (US 69%, Ontario 68%). Other elements noted—in order of preference—are "Armenian food" (US 60%, Ontario 49%), "The Genocide" (US 53%, Ontario 54%), "Being active in the Armenian community" (US 47%, Ontario 49%), and "Christian heritage" (US 43%, Ontario 47%).

Armenian language fluency

More than half (52%) in the US and nearly three quarters (72%) in Ontario assess their fluency in the Armenian language as "Fluent" (Q6). Nearly two in ten say their Armenian is "Intermediate" level (US 17%, Ontario 16%), while about one in ten (US 11%, Ontario 7%) has a "basic" knowledge of the language. Given that a large portion of the respondents in the Western part of the US are first generation immigrants, the number of those who consider themselves fluent speakers of Armenian is higher—six in ten (60%). Compared with the US, in Ontario a higher percent of fluent speakers are among the 35-54 and 55+ years old (69% and 77% respectively), while the percentage for the youngest generation of 18-24 years old in both communities is lower—in Ontario (60%) and lowest in the US (40%).

When asked which languages they speak with their children and which language is dominant in their communication, the responses were as follows:

The responses show that the Armenian language is still widely spoken in families, although it is slowly losing its dominant status moving down the generations. This is because more people speak English as the dominant language with their children than with their parents.

Community challenges

In response to a multiple choice question (Q8), "Lack of strong, visionary leadership in the Armenian community" is the top "challenge to the strength of the community" for nearly half of the respondents (US 46%, Ontario 43%). This is closely followed by the challenge of a "Divided or disunited community" (US 46%, Ontario 43%). Interestingly, higher percent of the younger generations indicated that divisions or disunity in the community is a top challenge to the strength of the community—18-24 (48%) and 25-34 (50%) years old. Other challenges among the top responses are: "Lack of events that interest young people" (US 37%, Ontario 39%) and "Lack of interesting/engaging Armenian community activities" (US 36% and Ontario 33%). These "challenges" were also common among the respondents of the communities surveyed in 2019 and 2021.

Activities needed in the communities

When asked "Which activities are needed in your local Armenian community?" (Q9), nearly six in ten (56%) in the US and nearly half in Ontario (47%) say "Lectures and activities on Armenian history, language, art, music, cooking, dance, etc." This need is highest in the US South region (65%), where smaller Armenian communities are sparsely spread. Almost half in Ontario (47%) and 44% in US wish to see "Professional networks" in their community. Not surprisingly, such networks are more in demand for the 25-34 years old in both Ontario (62%) and the US (52%).

Demand for children's activities and schools are also on top of the list. About **four in ten** wish to see **"Children's cultural activities, summer camps, scouts"** (US 42%, Ontario 40%), **"Armenian schools"** (US 39%, Ontario 42%) and **"Library, museums, other similar institutions"** (US 38%, Ontario 31%). In the US South, the need for schools is indicated by nearly half (47%) of the respondents.

In follow up questions about schools, a large majority of the respondents were positively disposed. When ask if they would send their children to an Armenian day school (Q14), six in ten say "Probably yes" (US total 57%, US West 62%, Ontario 65%). Only one in ten say "Probably no" (US 10%, Ontario 6%). A higher number of Armenians in the US South, about a quarter (24%), say they would probably not send their children to an Armenian school. Interestingly, more than a quarter of the 25-34 years old in the US (26%) are undecided. There is high interest in "after-school/weekend Armenian classes/programs" (Q16). About seven in ten say "Probably yes", they would send their children to afterschool or weekend Armenian classes or programs in the US (68%)—a higher percent in the US South (75%). In

Ontario—even as slightly fewer respondents (63%) than in the US said **"Probably yes"**—the interest for afterschool/weekend activities is highest among the 25-34 years old respondents, nearly **nine in ten** (89%).

Community and political engagement

The majority of the respondents in the US (72%) and Ontario (65%) are not "actively involved with any Armenian political parties or movements (including affiliated lobby organizations)" (Q10). However, this does not mean they are not politically active. About two in ten (16%) in the US and one in ten (10%) in Ontario say they are "involved politically in Armenian affairs but outside of established parties/movements." Involvement with the three Diaspora political parties combined is one in ten (12%) in the US and nearly a quarter (24%) of the respondents in Ontario.

There is high turnout for **national elections**: **eight in ten** in the US voted in the 2020 Presidential elections and **seven in ten** in Ontario voted in the 2021 Federal Elections.

Political views seem to be spread more or less evenly around prevalent political views in their respective countries and regions. In the background of the political party systems in the US and Canada, a quarter (26%) of the respondents in the US and one-third in Ontario (34%) say their political views are "Conservative". In the US Midwest and the South, a slightly higher number of respondents say they are "Conservative" in their political views (29% and 28% respectively). About a fifth of the respondents say "Liberal" (US 21%, Ontario 22%), but a quarter in the US (24%) and nearly a fifth (16%) in Ontario say their political views are a "Mixture". The least popular are "Progressive" views (US 17%, Ontario 8%). Interestingly, about a sixth (16%) of the respondents in Ontario did not wish to answer this question.

However, with some exceptions, the study suggests that Armenians in the US and Ontario tend to be open-minded about wider societal issues. For instance, a question (Q25) in the survey is related to views on LGBTQI. The large majority of the respondents in the US (73%) and Ontario (65%) say, "Yes, one can be LGBTQI and be a part of an Armenian community." A higher percent (84%) of the 25-34 years old in the US were in the affirmative. About two in ten (US 16%, Ontario 21%) of the respondents said they do not have an opinion on the issue or "Don't know". Only about one in ten (US 11%, Ontario 14%) said, "No, one cannot be LGBTQI and be a part of Armenian community".

Church and religion

When asked about faith, religion and church, six in ten in the US (63%) and seven in ten in Ontario (70%) said "I believe in God" (Q19). A higher percent of the 55+ years old (70%)—as well as respondents in the US Midwest (72%) and the US South (71%)—say they believe in God, but only about half (51%) of the 25-34 years old. A

smaller percent of respondents say they "believe in a spiritual force" (US 15%, Ontario 13%), while about one in ten say "Agnostic" (US 10%, Ontario 8%) and closely behind "Atheist" (US 8%, Ontario 6%). Interestingly, the distribution of responses (although not exact percentages) is close to that in the communities surveyed in 2019 and 2021.

When it comes to church affiliation (Q18), **out of ten** Armenians, **eight** are Armenian **Apostolic** (US 78%, Ontario 83%), **one** is Armenian **Catholic** (US 4%, Ontario 14%) or Armenian **Protestant** (US 12%, Ontario 10%) and **one** is affiliated with other non-Armenian churches or faiths. When it comes to "**communication**" with priests or ministers (Q22), **more than half** say it is primarily for "**Church services and rituals** (**baptism, wedding, funerals**)" (US 52%, Ontario 58%). Predictably, the 18-24 years old have the least "communication" with the clergy (29%), while 55+ years old has the most (62%). Less than two in ten communicate with the clergy for "Personal spiritual matters" (US 17%, Ontario 14) or "Family matters" (US 17%, Ontario 13%).

Views on ordination of women (Q20) is split: about a third of the respondents say "Women should have an opportunity to become Deacons" (US 30%, Ontario 31%), slightly fewer say "Women should have an opportunity to be ordained priests/ministers (US 26%, Ontario 22%). Interestingly, about another third of the respondents "Do not have an opinion on the matter" (US 31%, Ontario 34%). Only about one in ten say "No, women should not be ordained in Armenian churches" (US 13%, Ontario 13%).

Christianity in general is considered an important aspect of Armenian identity, however, half (50%) of the respondents in the US and a third (35%) in Ontario say "An Armenian can be of any faith or religion" (Q21), a higher percent of the younger generations in the US think so—18-24 years old (59%) and 25-34 (60%) years old. Fewer respondents in the US (20%) and Ontario (30%) say "An Armenian can only be Christian". About a fifth of the respondents (US 22%, Ontario 22%) think "Religion is not important to being Armenian"—a higher percent (28%) of the 25-34 years old in the US.

Homeland, Armenia, Artsakh

In an open-ended question, when asked to share the geographic location that they consider part of their identity as an Armenian (Q4), about **four in ten** say **"Republic of Armenia/Yerevan"** (US 43%, Ontario 42%), while the figures for **"Artsakh"** is 6% in US and 7% in Ontario. In the 2021 survey, the responses in the communities in Western Europe were higher, nearly six in ten said "Armenia/Yerevan" (58%), "Artsakh" 10% and "Ararat" 8%.

When asked, in a multiple-choice question, to select what they consider their "homeland" (Q26), more than half in the US (52%) and four in ten in Ontario (40%) say "homeland" is the country where I was born." However, nearly six in ten respondents in the US Northeast (59%), Midwest (58%), and the South (58%)—as well as the younger generations in Ontario, 18-24 (49%) and 25-34 (46%) years old—

consider their "country of birth" as homeland. Similar proportions of 47% in the US and 56% in Ontario consider the "Republic of Armenia or Artsakh" their "homeland". Other choices for "homeland" are "My ancestors' place of birth" (US 42%, Ontario 33%) and "the country where I live now" (US 31%, Ontario 36%).

About seven in ten (US 68%, Ontario 76%) have visited Armenia once or more times (Q27) and more than half (US 52%, Ontario 54%) "have plans and intend to visit the Republic of Armenia within the next two years" (Q28). However, when asked whether they have "considered living permanently in the Republic of Armenia or Artsakh" (Q29), the majority of the respondents say, "No, I would not want to live there" (US 66%, Ontario 62%). Only about a third of the respondents say "yes", they have plans or hope to move there one day (US 28%, Ontario 31%).

Diaspora support to Armenia

Regarding Diaspora assistance to the Republic of Armenia, when asked in which "areas should diaspora communities support in Armenia" (Q30), the large majority of the respondents indicate "Economic development and job creation" as top priority (US 83%, Ontario 82%). This is followed by "Education" (79%, 66%), "Infrastructure" (69%, 65%), "Healthcare (67%, 65%), "Human rights, democracy building" (67%, 67%), and "Security" (66%, 61%). Here again, these choices are close to the views of the responses in the communities surveyed in 2019 and 2021.

In response to a multiple-choice question about **the kind of active connections** they currently have in the Republic of Armenia or Artsakh (Q31), the top five responses are: **"Donating"** (US 58%, Ontario 53%), **"Family"** (49%, 44%), **"Friends, social life"** (47%, 47%), **"Spiritual connection"** (32%, 29%), and **"Volunteering"** (21%, 16%).

Key takeaways

- As in the previous communities surveyed in 2019 and 2021, the majority of Armenians in Ontario and the United States identity themselves as *hyphenated* Armenians—for instance, Armenian-American, Canadian-Armenian, American of Armenian origin, half or partly Armenian. The three most significant defining aspects of **Armenian identity** are the **family**, Armenian **language** and Armenian **culture**.
- Personal belief, Christianity and church are important for being Armenian, however, there is a wider range of views on **religion and religiosity**. Christianity and the Armenian Church are generally valued for being part of the Armenian "cultural," rather than purely religious, institutions. Indeed, for half of the respondents in the US, an Armenian can be of any faith or religion, and two in ten are either atheist or agnostic, or do not have opinion about religion.

- A considerable segment of Armenians in the US (about half of the respondents) and Ontario (three-quarters) consider themselves "fluent" speakers of the **Armenian language**, and about two in ten are intermediate level speakers. However, as expected, the younger generations are less fluent than their parents and grandparents.
- Armenian culture (food, dance, music, literature, etc.) is considered a significant part of being Armenian and is vital in community life. High-quality Armenian education and cultural activities are in demand in the US and Ontario—as they are in the other communities surveyed in 2019 and 2021.
- When it comes to the challenges for the vitality of the local **community**, the lack of visionary **leadership** is considered one of the major issues in both the US and Ontario—as well as in all other communities surveyed so far. Generally, **more interesting cultural and educational activities** (such as schools or after school activities) are in demand in the communities.
- As in the communities surveyed in previous rounds, the Republic of Armenia is not uniformly perceived as the "homeland", but there is a wide range of perceptions as to what the "homeland" is. The responses are more or less evenly split between those who consider their "place of birth" and those who consider the Republic of Armenia as homeland. The data suggests that those who say homeland is their place of birth (among other options) is not limited to respondents who were born in the Republic of Armenia. The views on the concept of "homeland" seem to reflect the hyphenated self-perception of diasporans, as illustrated in the question on identity. The homeland is not only the land where ancestors lived or where grandparents were forced to flee, or the Republic of Armenia today, but equally important is the land where one was born and developed as a person. Nevertheless, Armenia is considered an important point of reference for the diasporans. A large portion (seven in ten) of the survey respondents in the US and even more in Ontario (eight in ten) have already visited Armenia. An equally large number intends to visit Armenia in the near future. However, there is less interest in moving to the Republic of Armenia permanently—nearly seven in ten in the US and six in ten in Ontario do not wish to live there permanently.

Methodology

Hayk Gyuzalyan, Arpine Aghjoyan

he 2022 survey was organized in Armenian communities in the United States of America and Ontaria, Canada. The survey activities were concentrated in four communities—Los Angeles, Michigan, New York/New Jersey and Toronto—but the survey covered people living in all 50 states in the USA and Ontario, the second largest province in Canada. The survey was open to all respondents aged 18 and over, who considered themselves Armenian, without further restrictions on whether "Armenian" is defined by origin, by ethnicity, by self-description or by choice.

Questionnaire

Questionnaire development process

The questionnaire for this round was based on the Armenian Diaspora Survey 2019-2021 questionnaire, taking into consideration the results and the feedback during the data collection in the previous two rounds in 2019 and 2021. Based on the lessons learned in the previous stages of the research project, some questions were reformulated and response options were revised.

Questionnaire versioning: country variations, country-specific questions

The questionnaire was designed, discussed and finalized in English as the source language. Following the finalization of the source questionnaire, it was adapted for each community, by localizing questions related to country political processes and elections. All the questionnaires have 51 questions that are the same for both countries.

Scripting

For online polling, SurveyMonkey (now Momentive) platform was used. As the questionnaire versions vary a little from US to Ontario, a separate link to the online questionnaire was created for each country and for each language. Overall, 8 online questionnaires were created – 4 for the US, and 4 for Ontario (English, Eastern Armenian, Western Armenian and Russian in each country). The questionnaire links were shared on online platforms and extensive advertised through local media and community organizations.

Printing and layout

For those who do not use computers or social platforms, paper questionnaire were prepared, shared and distributed. The questionnaires were formatted into printable versions and were entered into the same database as the one created for the online questionnaires.

Questionnaire translations

The finalized questionnaire for each community was translated from the source language into fieldwork languages: Western Armenian, Eastern Armenian and Russian. As the Montreal community — surveyed in 2019 — was not included in the 2022 survey in Canada, there was no need for the questionnaire in French.

TRAPD model (translation, review, adjudication, pre-testing and documentation)

A team of people worked on the translation from source English language to each target language. Two translators made independent translations, which were then reviewed by the survey manager in each country. The discrepancies between the translated versions were documented in a separate file and the survey manager acting as adjudicator, made a decision on whether to use the translation 1, translation 2 or to use a different wording. The translated versions were tested before the start of the fieldwork and small final corrections were made in the piloting stage. Other fieldwork materials were translated using single straight translation.

Fieldwork

Timing

The fieldwork started on 6 May 2022, as planned in both countries. The fieldwork was completed on 31 July 2022.

Publicity and Social media strategy

For the effectiveness of data collection, publicity and special social media strategy was designed and implemented throughout fieldwork period. Facebook and Instagram were used as the main platforms for spreading the information about the survey, sharing the questionnaire links and information about the project. Specially designed photos, videos, and other various graphic materials were prepared for better coverage of Armenian Diaspora members in the respective communities.

Announcements and appeals for participation were disseminated through the mailing lists and networks of many community organizations (see list for each locality in the "Acknowledgements"). Flyers and promotional materials were placed at churches, schools, community centers, and local Armenian shops where possible. Before and during the fieldwork, announcements and appeals were published in local Armenian

newspapers and online media. ADS team members placed banners and promotional materials at major community events and festivals attended by hundreds of Armenians. (More detailed information about publicity and social media strategies are available in local fieldwork reports in ADS 2022 files.)

Data collection

Number of questionnaires collected was 9,458, as follows by country, mode and language:

In parallel with the online mode of completion, paper questionnaires were used in the targeted key communities. The paper questionnaires were offered at central location points for the Armenian community members: churches, Armenian schools, elderly care homes, local festivals and other community events. At these venues paper questionnaires were distributed along with relevant information about the survey, which served both as a data collection tool and as a tool to spread awareness of the survey, as well as to convince people to take the survey online if they prefer. In total, 82 paper questionnaires were collected in this round.

Data processing

In total, 9,458 questionnaires were collected across all four locations, through self-completion questionnaires and online completions. Out of those, 2,948 questionnaires were removed from the final dataset at the data cleaning stage and are not included in the reporting and analysis for a number of reasons. As the same questionnaire could have several criteria for disqualification, the reason for each case is mentioned based on the applied order. Some of the completed questionnaires did not represent respondents defined by the survey population. In particular, the following qualifiers:

- 1. 2 questionnaires were in the database, but they were test questionnaires, survey managers decided to make a trial on the live questionnaire.
- 2. As in the previous round there were cases where the respondent would fill in the questionnaire that came from different sources, there was a decision to ask the potential respondent whether they have already completed the questionnaire or not. So based on this criterion 66 questionnaires were disqualified.
- 3. After the survey introductory description, there was a question whether the respondent wants to continue. If the answer was no, the survey link expired. Out of all questionnaires, 34 did not wanted to continue the survey, and because of that they were disqualified.
- 4. In one case the paper questionnaire was inputted twice in the database, thus the second input was disqualified.
- 5. 10 questionnaires were removed from the database, because the respondents were under the specified age range.
- 6. Residence in the country and location where the survey takes place. There were no strict requirements on the exact residence of respondents at the time of fieldwork, but one of the objectives is to provide a snapshot of the community at one point in time. The IP origins of the completed questionnaires are kept by the online surveying tool. Tests were run using several different instruments (Info by IP and Geo IP) which allow identification of the country of origin of computer IPs. Those which were unequivocally identified as being originated outside of the study country were removed. In a minority of cases, different IP verifying instruments provided different responses on the country of origin, in those cases the interviews were kept in the dataset. Online tools for IP checking were used. If the country name was missing, but the city was mentioned, the information on the country was derived from the city name. If the country name was missing, and there is no city mentioned, the state and the country was derived from the IP. If the country name was other than US or Ontario, the questionnaire was removed. If the country name was missing, but the IP was out of US or Ontario, the questionnaire was removed. As such, based on the IP and country name checking results, 408 interviews were disqualified as the IP did not match the country of survey.
- 7. Another 102 questionnaires were removed from the Ontario database, as the responses came from regions other than Ontario.
- 8. 2,305 questionnaires were removed based on the completion rate. All the questionnaires that had less than 50% questions answered were removed from the database.
- 9. 16 questionnaires were removed based on the time that the respondents took for questionnaire completion. All the questionnaires that had less than 60% of the median duration were removed from the database.

10. 4 questionnaires were removed based on the answers to the open-ended questions, which were obvious that the respondents in these cases were not serious when answering the questions.

Completed questionnaires by location and language of completion

Overall, 6,510 completed questionnaires were considered valid and were used for analysis and reporting. The tables below show the number of questionnaires by mode of completion and language of completion in each survey location.

Data entry and checking

A single combined dataset was created for paper and online questionnaires. The online data was downloaded from SurveyMonkey with all languages and community questionnaire versions combined in one dataset. Completed paper questionnaires were scanned in different locations, but the data entry was organized centrally. The combined dataset was created in SPSS. Tables were created using question response items and certain aggregated variables as down breaks and key survey variables as cross breaks.

Open-ended responses have been translated from the language of completion into English. Based on the English responses, a coding frame was developed and responses were coded using the coding frame.

Mode of administration

The questionnaire was available for completion in two modes: paper and online. Paper questionnaires were printed and distributed by the research teams in each of the four fieldwork locations. They were primarily distributed by the research teams and were intended for self-completion by respondents. The research team was instructed to ensure certain standards of privacy during the completion of the questionnaires, to avoid the impact of other people influencing the survey responses. However, research team members were instructed to help with questions on the completion and administration of questionnaires. From the practical point of view, it

was not possible to completely avoid the influence of other people during the completion of questionnaires, so a special question was added in the questionnaire to indicate whether the questionnaire was completed with the assistance of any other person. This information is contained in the dataset (A50) and can be used to analyze the potential impact of presence of other people on responses to different survey questions.

Data editing, cleaning and coding

As there were questions with open-ended answers and "Other" as an option, there was a need to edit those responses during the data processing stage.

- 1. In A1, the responses mentioned in "Other" were either recoded or cleaned based on the textual information.
- 2. In A2, the responses were coded into existing and new values.
- 3. In A4 every entry was checked and when needed was replaced by the current name of the location. In case the mentioned geographic location was not possible to find, nothing was done and the name of the location was left as it was written by the respondent. The duplicate locations per respondent were removed.
- 4. In A7 group of languages question, if there was just one language spoken, it was considered as the dominant language and was added in the database. If the dominant language was not mentioned in the list of spoken languages, it was added in the list of spoken languages in the database.
- 5. In A18, the religions, faiths and churches were combined. For all the mentioned names, the original/official name of the religion, faith and church was added in the codebook.
- 6. In A26, if several options were mentioned in "Other", they were all separated and coded accordingly. Several new codes were added, most of the answers were recoded into already existing list of answers.
- 7. In A31 several new codes were introduced, the rest was recoded into already existing list of answers.
- 8. In A32, A33 and A34 every entry was checked and when needed was replaced by the current name of the location. In case the mentioned geographic location was not possible to find, nothing was done and the name of the location was left as was written by the respondent.
- 9. In A35, if more than one option was mentioned, the earlier generation was considered as an option (for example, if grandparents with their children (parent of the respondent) settled in the country of current residence).

- 10. In A41 respondents mentioned the type of job they are/were doing or if now retired. Overall, 21 codes were introduced based on the internationally recognized list of job families.
- 11. In A43, the ethnicities/nationalities were combined by the standards of ethnicity classification based on the region.
- 12. In A44, the races/group of races were combined by the standards of race classification based on the region.
- 13. In A49, the names of the cities and countries were cleaned, the current names of the places were added.
- 14. In A51, the places were combined based on the activity type, i.e., educational institutions, vacations, etc.

Weighting

The data has been weighted to the known socio-demographic profile in each country using rim (Random Iterative Method) weighting procedures. The data has not been weighted to the population size or the size of Armenian community in each country.

Sources of information for weighting

There is no reliable information about the socio-demographic profile of Armenians in each survey country, in particular, the age and gender breakdowns. It was decided to use the national data on age and gender for the corresponding weighting profiles:

As each country does the census by different age breaks—and as the age split in the questionnaires did not always overlap with the age in the census data—the needed age groups were estimated proportionally. Additionally, the data was weighted by the population of Armenians in each region—to compensate for the inevitable focus of the study on the capital cities in each country. For the population of Armenians in each region, weighting was based on the estimates from the Armenian community.

For the data weighting the main factors used were age and gender for US and Canada and region only for the US.

For age, the following groups were taken into consideration: 18-24, 25-34, 35-54, 55+.

The following information sources were used for age and gender: The US Census Bureau, 2020 Census Statistics Canada, 2016 Census

Weighting by geographical regions

For categorization and weighting, the US population was divided into four regions: East Coast, Midwest, West Coast and South. The states included in each region are as follows:

One of the challenges of measuring the views of the Armenian population in the United States is knowing the exact size of the population in different geographical parts of the country. There are no formal census, official figures or reliable information about the size of the Armenian population nor are there exact boundaries of what constitutes being an Armenian (or, for that matter, any other ethnic minority living in the diaspora). Against this background, to estimate the Armenian population in different parts of the United States, we asked a number of executives of leading community organizations and academics to provide their estimates of the population size of the Armenian diaspora in different regions of the country. Nine out of the 12 executives and academics we asked responded as follows:

Given that the objective is to assess the relative proportion of the target population in each region, we accepted the percentage distribution—instead of absolute figures—provided by the executives and academics we asked. We then removed the two extreme estimates, the lowest and the highest. The median of the resulting

population size estimates were then taken as the basis for the weighting procedures, as follows:

Rim weighting

The rim weighting procedure was used for calculating the overall weights. The reason why rim weighting was chosen is because there were targets (census data), but no targets for the interlocking cells for these 3 variables: age, gender, region. In the next step, the combination of these 3 variables was created separately for each country. Here are the combinations per country:

US: 4 age groups x 2 gender groups x 4 regions = 32 combinations Ontario: 4 age groups x 2 gender groups x 1 region = 8 combinations

Limitations

Multicode limitations: given that the survey was not exclusively online, there is no way to control the amount of selected options. Thus, to avoid inconsistency issues, it is better to have "all that apply".

The geographical locations were intentionally left open, so the respondents could specify city, village or broader location. In question A4 we have responses from small villages to countries and large geographical regions. For the question on *homeland* (see Q33 in this report), some respondents mentioned actual countries, places and it was not clear whether it was their country of birth, or the place where parents or ancestors were born.

Qualitative fieldwork

In-depth interviews were organized simultaneously with the quantitative data collection. The in-depth interview guide was amended after the previous round of data collection to reflect the changes in the questionnaire and topics. The changes were discussed with the ADS Academic Advisory Committee and finalized by the ADS team (see inside back cover).

In each community, a researcher organized in-depth interviews with the members of the Armenian community. Between 20 and 30 interviews were planned in each community. Similar to the previous rounds of data collection, recruitment and interviewing were organized around the following quotas, which were deemed essential for the key information in the research: age, gender, immigration generation and engagement (or lack thereof) with the Armenian community. Several other factors were included as important, but targets were not set for those: political party affiliation, occupation / type of work, level of education, religion and use of Armenian language. Quota targets were set at ensuring a minimum number of respondents for each criterion, rather than a proportional representation of the population in each group.

The quotas were set as desirable and efforts were made to achieve the target quotas, however, having four strict quotas with limited recruitment opportunities was not

practical. In some countries, certain quotas were not achieved, due to a very small number of people in the community fitting the criteria, combined with the other critical criteria such as engagement with the community.

The interviews were audio recorded with the respondents' consent.




Question 1. Which of the following best describes how you think of yourself?





Question 16. Would you send your children to after-school/weekend Armenian classes/programs? Those who do not have children of school age.










